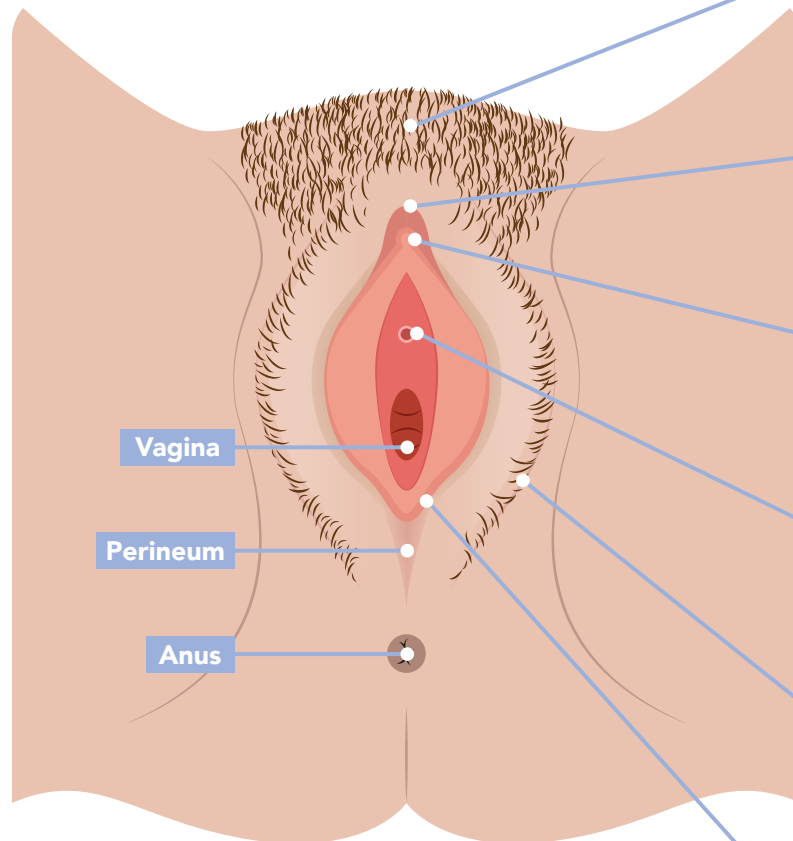


Vulva

The **vulva** collectively describes the **female external genitalia**, and includes the mons pubis, labia majora, labia minora, clitoris, fourchette, and perineum



Mons Pubis

The **mons pubis** is the pad of fatty tissue that covers the pubic bone

Clitoral Hood

The **clitoral hood** is the small flap of skin where the two labia minora meet

Clitoris

The **clitoris** serves as the main source of sensation during sexual activity

Urethra

The **urethra** is a tube that carries urine out of the body, from the bladder

Labia Majora

The **labia majora** ("outer lips") are skin folds on either side of the vaginal opening that have hair and oil glands

Labia Minora (and the Fourchette)

The **labia minora** ("inner lips") are thinner skin folds ranging in length, that do not contain any hair, but have oil glands and nerves

The **fourchette** is where the bottom of the labia minora (inner folds) meet

Vagina

The **vagina** is part of the female genital tract, between the uterus and the outer female genitalia (i.e. the vulva)

Perineum

The **perineum** refers to the area between the vaginal opening to the anus

Anus

The **anus** is where stool leaves the body, leading from the intestinal tract
